We'll view the architecture, visit museums, artist studios and workshops, experience a range of music, walk through historic Jewish districts, join two of Havana's active Jewish communities for Shabbat and Shabbat meals, and visit the Holocaust Memorials of Havana and Santa Clara. We'll visit spectacular landscapes and World Heritage Sites, including Pinar Del Rio, Cienfuegos, Valle de los Ingenios, Trinidad, Santa Clara, and Remedios. We'll discover so much more in our stay at the renowned 5-star Hotel Nacional and the restored 4-star Modernist Jagua Hotel of Cienfuegos.

### Day 1 - SUNDAY (March 23, 2014) - TAMPA TO HAVANA (D)

2 PM - Arrive Tampa International Airport. 5 PM Depart Tampa to Havana. Arrive at Havana Airport @6:20 PM. Transfer to **5-star Hotel Nacional**. This is a good time for currency exchange. You will purchase all goods with CUC's (Cuban Convertible Pesos). USD can be exchanged at hotels. No US credit cards or US travelers cheques are accepted. We **tour this historic hotel** which since 1930 has been frequented by famous and notorious, business elite, politician, military officer, and diplomat alike. The hotel is in the center of the city's activity and exhibits an eclectic Art Deco architectural style with Arabic, Hispano-Moorish, neo-classical and neo-colonial elements and rooms in their original Art Deco decor, making it one of the most distinctive hotels in the Caribbean. **Welcome Cocktail** at Hotel Nacional, followed by **dinner at the Comedor de Aguiar**, the luxury restaurant in our hotel. The **Havana Malecón** (seaside promenade) is a few minutes' walk from our hotel. Take a stroll after dinner to enjoy the music, activity, and locals.



**Day 2 - MONDAY (March 24, 2014) - HAVANA-JAIMANITAS (B, L)** Breakfast at hotel. This morning begins with a **walking tour through the historic UNESCO Jewish Havana district and Acosta Street** with its restored orthodox Adath Israel Synagogue, Menorah courtyard, ornate Hotel Raquel, the Jewish residential Belen Neighborhood, plus Cuba's only Kosher butcher shop. Lunch is included. We'll see the **Plaza de la Revolution** with its memorial statue of José Martí, hero of Cuba's late 19th century revolution against the Spanish, and the **Museum of the Revolution** with its noted national relics. We'll visit the renowned **Maqueta de la Habana (Havana model)**, a nearly 1550 sq. ft. model of the city that can be viewed by walking around it at floor level and from a balcony above. This afternoon we'll bus 8 miles to the quaint fishing town of **Jaimanitas** to visit **The Caribbean Picasso, José Rodríguez Fuster**, who specializes in whimsical ceramics, painting, drawing, engraving, and graphic design. In addition to creating his stunning open air workshop-gallery at his home, Fuster has rebuilt and decorated more than 80 houses in Jaimanitas, making the entire town a work of public art. We'll see his spectacular murals and ceramics, his Chess Park with its giant boards and tables, The Artists' Wall composed of a quilt of dozens of tiles signed and donated by other Cuban artists, his Doctor's Surgical Center and other buildings that display his one-of-a-kind creativity. Dinner on your own (not included). In the evening we'll attend the spectacular **La Parisien Show** at our hotel.

**Day 3 - TUESDAY (March 25, 2014) - HAVANA-CIENFUEGOS (B, L, D)** Breakfast at Hotel. Check out of the Hotel Nacional (but we'll return in several days, so extra luggage may be safely stored for your return) for a 4-hour drive to **Cienfuegos**, a charming city originally settled by French immigrants in the early 19th century. It is today one of Cuba's chief seaports, a center of sugar, coffee, and tobacco trade. Lunch at the stunning and ornate **Palacio de Valle** Restaurant and Historical Monument, a Spanish-Moorish-Gothic architectural jewel. A visit to the **Cienfuegos Historic Center** and **Parque José Martí** with its statues, plants, shops, and city hall. **El Bulevard**, the central boulevard, winds its way by historic buildings and is a center of activity. The 18th century **Cathedral de Cienfuegos** with neo-classical front, red bell towers, arched doors and splendid French stained glass is a must-see. The **Tomás Terry Theatre National Monument**, a beautifully preserved neoclassical luxury theatre house with portico of mosaics, 4 levels, ornate ceiling, paintings, portraits, and statues. The **Cienfuegos Malecón** sea drive/promenade cuts along this natural bay and exquisite vista. In the evening, it comes to life with music and activity of every kind: walk here or to the City Center in minutes from our hotel.

The **Cementerio La Reina**, a stunning cemetery founded in 1837, is famous for its stone garden filled with baroque architecture and neo-classical tombstones and statues made entirely of imported carrara marble. We'll hear and interact with the **Cantores de Cienfuegos Youth Choir** and check in at the **4-star Jagua Hotel**, enjoying dinner in the hotel. This Modernist 50's-era hotel, one of Cuba's best known, recently underwent a renovation for which it received the National Award for Restoration of Monuments. Its pool deck overhangs the bay with one of the most beautiful ocean landscapes in the Caribbean.

**Day 4 - WEDNESDAY (March 26, 2014) - TRINIDAD-CIENFUEGOS (B, L, D)** Breakfast at Hotel. One-hour excursion to **Trinidad**, a breathtaking and deeply rich historical region founded 1514, the third Spanish settlement in Cuba, one of the finest-preserved colonial cities in the world and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Walk the **Playa del Mayor**, the charming historic centre of town. Explore significant colonial landmarks such as the **Iglesia Parraquial de la Santísima** (Church of the Holy Trinity—a focal point of the city and Cuba's largest church) and **Brunet Palace** of 1812, which houses the stunning **Romantic Museum's** impeccably preserved porcelain, glass, paintings, ceramics, and decorative furniture that belonged to the nobility. Trinidad is renowned for **ceramic works**, a craft passed from generation to generation by the most skilled and famous artist families. Visit a **ceramic artist workshop** and have lunch at the **El Jigue Restaurant**—a charming, airy, and elegant

colonial house a block from the Plaza. Tour the **Valle de los Ingenios**, the Valley of the Sugar Mills, which served as a center of sugar production for a century. Its panoramic views and astounding history have earned it the title of UNESCO World Heritage Site. Once, more than 60 mills operated here with some 30,000 slaves working the plantations. We visit one of the 12 remaining mills, learn of the history of the valley, and close the afternoon with a visit to **Manaca Iznaga**, a Spanish colonial 7-story observation tower built in 1816. We return to Cienfuegos and dinner at **Club Cienfuegos** on the bayfront overlooking the marina. Sunset here is described as one of the most magnificent in Cuba. Overnight at Jagua Hotel.

**Day 5 - THURSDAY (March 27, 2014) - SANTA CLARA-REMEDIOS-HAVANA (B, L)** Breakfast at Hotel. One-hour bus drive to **Santa Clara**, the capital city of its province and an important historical region of Cuba. Founded in 1689, this city has for centuries been a home of Cuban rebels and was the last battle in the Cuban Revolution in late 1958, led by Che Guevara. We are here to experience the beautiful parks and historic buildings as well as the **Sephardic Jewish Community, Comunidad Tikkun Olam**, its **synagogue Or Hadash** in the city center, and its **Holocaust Memorial**. Visit the 1885 **Teatro de la Cariad**, one of Cuba's most famous and host to individuals of world renown such as Enrico Caruso. It and the **Parque Vidal** are National Monuments. Visit **Marta Abreu de Estevez University** and hear of Santa Clara's rich history, then continue some 30 miles east to the quiet coastal city of **Remedios**, eighth oldest city in Cuba (founded 1514) and described as a quaint, hidden gem. Lunch at **Hotel Mascotte**, a charming historic hotel on the main square. The central area of Remedios is a collection of gorgeous monuments and colonial buildings, including the oldest church in Cuba, The **Iglesia Parroquial Mayor San Juan Bautista** (built 1692 on the foundation of an earlier church constructed in 1570) with its ornate ceiling and breathtaking gold-leaf cedar altars. The gold was hidden for centuries under white paint to keep it safe from pirates who constantly besieged this city. When renovation began in 1944, the gold was rediscovered. Remedios also contains a fascinating smaller-scale replica of the Statue of Liberty known as the **Liberty Statue of Remedios** constructed in marble from the quarry of Carrara, Italy by Italian sculptor Carlo Nicoli. It was dedicated to Cubans who lost their lives during the War of Cuban Independence from Spain. We **return to Havana** and check back in to the Hotel Nacional. Dinner at leisure (not included).

**Day 6 - FRIDAY (March 28, 2014) - HAVANA (B, D)** Breakfast at Hotel. Tour Havana's commercial center, the **Vedado Neighborhood**—the vibrant downtown and residential district outside our hotel. Possibly see a popular morning activity, **Hebrew school classes** for children and adults. View Vedado's avenues and mansions from the 1920's such as **Museo de Artes Decorativas** and **Casa de la Amistad**. See **Havana University** and **Colón Cemetery** (purportedly Christopher Columbus' resting place). Lunch on your own (not included). Visit the **Plaza de la Revolution** with its memorial statue of José Martí, hero of Cuba's late 19th century revolution against the Spanish, and the **Museum of the Revolution** with its noted national relics. Experience a local **Cuban jazz or folk performance** and visit both **Jewish cemeteries** (Ashkenazi/Sephardic) in Guanabacoa containing the first **Holocaust Memorials** in the western hemisphere, erected in 1947. Return to the hotel by about 4:00 PM to prepare for Shabbat (Sunset is 7:44 PM). Tonight's **Kabbalat Shabbat services and dinner with Temple Beth Shalom (El Patronato Synagogue - conservative)** allow us to meet members of Havana's Jewish community. We will deliver donations of goods to this community. Return to our hotel. **NOTE: Our hotel is not within walking distance of active synagogues. Bus transportation will be provided for those who desire to join the Jewish communities on Friday night and Saturday.**

**Day 7 - SATURDAY (March 29, 2014) - HAVANA (B, L, D)** Hotel Breakfast. As you desire, attend **Shabbat morning service and Kiddish Lunch at the Centro Hebreo Sefardi de Cuba (conservative)**. We will deliver donations of goods to this community. **Free afternoon** relaxing, walking along the Malecón, or other sightseeing. Dinner at **La Barraca**, the Hotel Nacional's open-air seaside restaurant with its stunning view. We share **our own Havdalah service** at sunset.

**Day 8 - SUNDAY (March 30, 2014) - PINAR DEL RIO (B, L)** Breakfast at Hotel. Today's day trip to the island's westernmost region, **Pinar del Rio**, brings us to what many describe as the most beautiful province of Cuba with its majestic mountain ranges. Tobacco is the main crop here and is world renowned, so our day includes a visit to a tobacco plantation. We'll also explore the environmentally conscious "**Las Terrazas**" project, a community of nearly 1,000 residents in a picturesque village winding along the terraces overlooking a lake created by the San Juan River Dam. The primary work here is reforestation to cure severe deforestation from 19th century colonial coffee plantation owners, which led to destruction of the ecosystem, degradation of the land, and poverty for the locals. Now an official **UNESCO Biosphere Reserve**, the Las Terrazas project serves as world model. We'll see local and historic sites, visit with the people, lunch at **Casa del Campedino Restaurant**, and in late day return to Havana to our hotel. Dinner on your own (not included).

**Day 9 - MONDAY (March 31, 2014)- HAVANA-COJIMAR (B, D)** Breakfast at Hotel. Today's "**Hemingway Day**" includes Hemingway's home, **Finca Vigia**, and lunch at **Las Terrazas** in the fishing village of **Cojimar**, which inspired Hemingway's *Old Man and the Sea*. An architect guides us through **Old Havana's** historic areas, including **Plaza de Armas, San Francisco Square and Church, Museum of the City** (the former Governor's Palace), **La Fuerza Castle** (with an explanation of the city's historic defensive system) and **Obispo and Mercaderes Streets**. Of all the city's castles, La Fuerza is the strongest and most formidable. It was built by Hernando de Soto before his discovery of the Mississippi River and is the oldest fort in the New World. Lunch on your own (not included) After lunch, visit the **Centro Cultural Almacenes (Artisans Market) of San José** and interact with local artisans. We finish day with a cocktail at Hemingway's favorite bar, **El Floridita** and an evening dinner in the Vedado District near our hotel at **Café Laurent**, a family-run restaurant on a residential rooftop noted for its views, ambiance, and distinctive food.

**Day 10 - TUESDAY (April 1, 2014) - HAVANA (B, D)** Breakfast at Hotel. Visit the **Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes de la Habana** (Museum of Fine Arts of Havana), to see its **Cuban Arts** collection, with an extensive display of Cuban paintings spanning the 17th century to the latest generation of Cuban artists, including landscape, religious subjects, and Cuban life. Afterward, we'll visit **artist workshops** in the picturesque **Old City of Havana**. Lunch (not included) and free afternoon will be at your leisure. Dinner this evening is at **Divina Pastora**, known for its unique and stunning view over Havana Bay and the city from the veranda, along with its intimacy and fine food. After dinner, we visit **La Cabaña Fortress** for the exciting, colorful **9 PM Cannon Ceremony**, in which soldiers dressed in 18th century uniform fire a cannon over Havana bay in a historical reconstruction dating to colonial times. We return to our hotel for our final night.

**Day 11 - WEDNESDAY (April 2, 2014) - HAVANA-TAMPA (B)** Hotel Breakfast. Havana is birthplace of the world's finest cigars, and our visit to a **Havana Cigar Factory** is a world of history, craft, and senses unto itself. Then we stop at **Sloppy Joe's Bar** for a quick lunch of tapas or sandwiches (not included) and photograph this restaurant, just restored and reopened in April 2013 after 48 years closed. Founded in 1918, Sloppy Joe's was a former hangout of American tourists and the rich and famous—including John Wayne, Spencer Tracy, Errol Flynn, Frank Sinatra, Ava Gardner, Rock Hudson, Babe Ruth, Nat King Cole, and Clark Gable—before the revolution. A frequent patron was Ernest Hemingway. Joy's parents had a honeymoon photo taken here and perhaps you may have souvenir family photos similar to the one pictured to the right. And here's a tidbit of history: the bar's name was inspired by its famous sandwich, the **ropa vieja**, meaning "old clothes." This messy sandwich contained shredded or ground steak in a tangy tomato-based sauce and was called a Sloppy Joe after the nickname of the owner José. Following the Cuban revolution in 1959, the bar was nationalized, then closed and abandoned in 1965. Now after a 3-year restoration it is again open, brought back exactly as it was—including its famous long black mahogany bar that you can see in the 1959 British film, *Our Man in Havana*, starring Alec Guinness and Maureen O'Hara. **We transfer at 1 PM to Havana International Airport** for our return flight to Tampa at 3:10 PM. You must have 25 Cuban Pesos departure tax (= \$25 USD) at check-in. Arrive in Tampa at @4:30 PM.

**TERMS: Deposit of \$500 due no later than October 23, 2013**, one-half of which is refundable up until 60 days prior to departure. *Please do not wait to reserve your space—Reserve IMMEDIATELY. Full payment due 60 days prior to departure, January 23, 2014* and is non-refundable. Cash/Check/Money Order accepted. All major credit cards accepted with 3% fee except AMEX, which is a 4% fee. Call Carol at 727-826-0001 with credit card information. You must have a current passport that does not expire within 6 months of your return. **Our Humanitarian Mission** is to bring donations to the Jewish community: prayer shawls, yarmulkes, menorahs, candles, tefillin, prayer texts (Hebrew/Spanish), CD's, Shabbat/Havdalah/Hanukkah candles, books, coloring books, crayons, chalk, toys/games, clothing, art supplies, musical instruments, guitar strings, pens/paper, soap, toothpaste, toiletries, makeup, thermometers, gloves, shoes, Spanish/English dictionaries, medicines like aspirin, ibuprofen, antibiotic cream, band-aids, vitamins, sheets and towels, sponges, and cash donations. These items are not easily attainable to the residents of Cuba.
